*DinoQuest Monster Movie Night Set for Friday, July 30***

(ST. LOUIS): It's a monster mash-up of cult classics with a dinosaur twist at the Missouri Botanical Garden! In conjunction with the "DinoQuest: A Tropical Trek Through Time" exhibition, the Garden presents a **DinoQuest Monster Movie Night** outdoors on the lawn of the Cohen Amphitheater, Friday, July 30 from 7 p.m. to midnight (last entry at 10 p.m.). View the DinoQuest exhibit and pack a picnic for two back-to-back movies starting at sundown. Purchase tickets at the door for \$10 per person (\$5 for Garden members).

The DinoQuest exhibit will be open late from 7 to 9 p.m. and is included with Monster Movie Night admission. Take a jaunt through the Climatron[®] tropical rain forest and Shoenberg Temperate House to see dozens of dinosaurs and other reptiles "frozen in time" amid living flora, enhanced by dramatic lighting and fog elements for evening viewing.

Around 8:30 p.m., settle in to your lawn chairs and blanket to enjoy a picnic supper and two larger-than-life cult classics from the 1960s. The first film features the

giant, fictional lepidopteran Mothra from Infant Island who wreaks havoc on a metropolis before returning to its home (run time: 101 minutes). The second feature highlights an epic battle of the alien monster Giron versus the giant flying turtle Gamera on the planet Terra (run time: 82 minutes). Both films will be shown on a giant screen at the Cohen Amphitheater, located west of the Climatron dome on the Garden grounds. Lawn seating only; guests are welcome to bring lawn chairs or blankets and to picnic at this special event. Snacks and beverages will also be available for purchase.

The Missouri Botanical Garden is located at 4344 Shaw Blvd. in south St. Louis, accessible from Interstate 44 at the Vandeventer exit and from Interstate 64 at the Kingshighway North & South exit. Free parking is available on-site and two blocks west at the corner of Shaw and Vandeventer.

The Missouri Botanical Garden’s mission is “to discover and share knowledge about plants and their environment in order to preserve and enrich life.” Today, 151 years after opening, the Missouri Botanical Garden is a National Historic Landmark and a center for science, conservation, education and horticultural display.

The Missouri Botanical Garden is located at 4344 Shaw Blvd. in St. Louis, just south of I-44 at Vandeventer-Kingshighway (exit #287B). Open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. every day except Dec. 25. Grounds open at 7 a.m. Wednesdays and Saturdays (exception: special admission rate events). Admission is \$8; free children ages 12 and under and Garden members. St. Louis City and County residents are \$4 and free Wednesdays and Saturdays until noon (exception: special admission rate events - third weekend of May, Labor Day weekend, and first weekend of October). Park for free on site and two blocks west at the Shaw-Vandeventer intersection. The Garden is easily accessible by taking the MetroLink commuter rail line to the Central West End station and picking up a Metro bus (www.metrostlouis.org).
